

Canadian Legal Searches:

- Click on the **International Legal** button on the left side of the screen
- Select Canadian Cases or Canadian Legislation from the menu
- If you are searching for Canadian Labour Arbitration Cases (L.A.C.) or Canadian Criminal Cases (C.C.C.), see the instructions below:

Canadian Labour Arbitration Cases:

- Go to **Research by Country** on the **Easy Search** page
- Click on the link for **Browse Sources** at the bottom of this section

On the next page:

- Under **2. Filter by Country**, select **Canada** from the drop-down menu
- Click on the folder for **Boards, Panels, and Tribunals**
- On the next page, select **Labour Law Tribunal Decisions–Topical** from the list of options
- Click on the **OK-Continue** button on the right side of the screen
- Enter your keywords in the box on the screen (e.g. **Nunavut and Public Service Alliance of Canada**) and click on **Search**
- In the results list for your search, you should be able to identify the L.A.C. case by the date of the decision. When you retrieve the full text of the case on the screen, the L.A.C. reference should be found under the title of the case (e.g. **151 L.A.C. (4th) 35**)

Canadian Criminal Cases:

- Go to **Research by Country** on the **Easy Search** page
- Click on the link for **Browse Sources** at the bottom of this section

On the next page:

- Under **2. Filter by Country**, select **Canada** from the drop-down menu
- Click on the folder for **Cases**
- On the next page, **Go to page starting with Source** and select “Canada Copyright Board Decisions”
- On the next page, select **Criminal Law Cases–Topical** from the list of options
- Click on the **OK-Continue** button on the right side of the screen
- Enter your keywords in the search box (e.g. **R. v. Mitchell**) and click on **Search**
- On the next page, you may narrow down the number of results by selecting the provincial court responsible for the decision (e.g. **New Brunswick Judgments**) from the menu on the left side of the screen
- You should be able to find your case by the date the judgment was rendered
- When you retrieve the full text of the case on the screen, the C.C.C. reference should be found under the title of the case (e.g. **204 C.C.C. (3d) 289**)
