International Fees and Financing

2011-12 Academic Year

The tuition fee for international students is **\$11,365.85** for most programs for the 2011-12 academic year. This amount includes mandatory health insurance.

Once you have received an offer of admission, a non-refundable confirmation fee of \$400, is required to reserve your seat in the program. First semester tuition fees should be paid in full before applying for a Study Permit. Fees can be paid by credit card (Visa, MasterCard or American Express), certified cheque, draft or money order (made payable to Cambrian College), or by electronic transfer. If paying by electronic transfer, you will need the following information:

Please indicate your student number on any transfer made and alert us if you are paying by electronic transfer so that we may know to apply the payment to your account. You are responsible for any banking fees relating to the transfer and should, therefore, increase the amount you transfer to cover these expenses (about \$10 at the Canadian bank, plus your bank's fees).

The \$400 confirmation fee will be applied to the total tuition. It is not transferrable to another academic year and is non-refundable.

Other Costs to Consider:

We estimate that one year of study (8 months) at Cambrian College will cost you approximately \$21,000, including tuition, books, accommodation, etc. This may vary depending on your personal situation and preferences. Here is the suggested breakdown to consider as you prepare your financial budget:

- The above tuition does not include the cost of textbooks or supplies (approximately \$700 to \$1,700 per year, depending on program).
- The estimated cost of living at residence is \$5,050 for one academic year (September to April). Students will need to apply on an individual basis to residence by e-mail cambrian@staycc.com
- Off-campus housing (apartment or room) is also available and can range from \$4,000 to \$8,000 per academic year. Students are responsible for booking their own housing.
- Additional expenses include food, clothing, household supplies, local travel costs, telephone, entertainment etc. (approximately \$4,000 to \$10,000 for one academic year).

By sending us your application, you are confirming your understanding of this financial commitment and your ability to meet your financial obligations.

Planning Your Finances

Financial planning is an integral part of preparing for your postsecondary studies. Determining what your expenses and sources of income will be is just as crucial to a positive college experience as are researching your intended program of study and learning more about the campus and about Canada.

All international students who apply to study in Canada must have sufficient resources to be self-reliant in order to obtain a Study Permit. To work off-campus while studying you must possess a valid study permit, have studied full-time for at least six months out of the previous 12 months, and maintain a 2.0 GPA with no failing grades. For further information, contact your nearest Canadian Embassy, Consulate, or High Commission office.

Cambrian College is committed to ensuring you have a positive learning experience during your stay with us. For this reason, we must advise you that failure to meet your financial responsibility with the College may result in the termination of your program and, therefore, of your Canadian Study Permit. To avoid this, please plan your finances carefully prior to applying to Cambrian and be ready to meet all your financial obligations.

Sources of Financial Assistance

Regretfully, Cambrian is unable to provide financial assistance or scholarships to international students. Only students who have paid their fees and are in at least their second semester of studies may be eligible to apply for scholarship opportunities.

It is your responsibility to identify, research, and secure sponsorships and bursaries to support your studies. As a first step, you may wish to contact the Canadian Embassy nearest you or to contact your own country's Embassy in Canada for guidance in this area. Other sources may also be available; however, we are unable to maintain a current list of these possible sources.
