

## 2011-2012 Fall/Winter Dual Credit Offerings

Program Name	Ministry High School Code	Offered	Description
Exploring Art and Design (AFDC)	AEB4T	Fall 2011	In this course, students will develop an overview of art and design career options through a process of portfolio development. Students will discover the various skills required and the various careers available in the art and design professions. The students will work on projects spanning the continuum from traditional arts and crafts to leading edge technical applications using digital media.
Exploring Corrections (CODC)	HCB4T	Fall 2011	In this course, students will examine community-based programs for both adult and young persons from alternatives to incarceration to conditional release and the impact of public attitudes on support for such programs. Emphasis is also given to victims, restorative justice and the process of reintegration for special offender populations. Students will also have an opportunity to assess career alternatives through discussions with guest speakers from the community corrections system.
Exploring Early Childhood Education (ECDC)	TOQ4T	Fall 2011	In this course, students will examine the principles of creating indoor and outdoor learning environments. Students will also identify specific inclusions for both indoor and outdoor play. An important component in the development of creative learning environments is the child's play. Students will examine the historical understandings of play and stages of play in detail.
Metal Fabricator (Fitter) and Welder Common Core Level 1 Apprenticeship Program (MFDC)	OZP4T	Fall 2011	This program will focus on the skills required for welding fabrication common core with an emphasis on hands-on skills development. Students are registered under OYAP as apprentices.
College Connection (CCDC)	GLH4T	Fall 2011	This program will re-engage students and provide them with skills in time management, learning strategies, goal setting, etc. and will provide them with exposure to career exploration. Upon successful completion and recommendation from the first semester professor and the teacher in the dedicated role, students can then choose one general education course in the following semester from a list of several options where they could be granted access into a college course
Apprenticeship Plus-Chef Training Level I (APBC)	TKA4Y	Winter 2012	Through this exploration of the hospitality field, students will earn postsecondary credits that can be used if they continue their studies in the Chef Training or Hotel and Restaurant Management programs. Students are registered under OYAP as apprentices.

Exploring Baking and Pastry Arts (BPDC)	TUE4T	Winter 2012	Through this exploration of the field of baking and pastry arts, students will earn postsecondary credits that can be used if they continue their studies in the Baking and Pastry Arts program at Cambrian. In addition to receiving recognition for the entire first semester of Cambrians Baking and Pastry Arts program, students will also receive the Nutrition credit from the second semester of the program.
Exploring Health and Wellness (HWDC)	PPI4T	Winter 2012	In this course, students will learn how their lives can be enhanced by a fit and healthy lifestyle. This course will motivate students to make healthy choices and provide them with the necessary knowledge to make positive behavioral changes. To look and feel our best, to protect ourselves from degenerative diseases, and to enjoy the highest quality of life, we need to place fitness and wellness among our top priorities. Topics such as nutrition, principles of physical fitness, stress and cardiovascular health will be discussed. NOTE: This course involves physically related activities so the students should be medically sound to participate in physical activities.
Commercial Vehicle & Heavy Equipment/Heavy Duty Level 1 Apprenticeship (CVDC)	OZE4T	Winter 2012	This program will focus on the skills required for Commercial Vehicle and Heavy Duty Equipment common core with an emphasis on hands-on skills development. Students are registered under OYAP as apprentices.
General Carpenter Level 1 Apprenticeship (GCDC)	OZT4T	Winter 2012	Completion of this program will provide students with two secondary school credits as well as the basic in-school Level 1 training of the apprenticeship. This program will focus on the skills required in carpentry with an emphasis on hands-on skills development. Students will be registered as Level 1 Carpenter Apprentices.
Videography (VIDC)	TGN4T	Winter 2012	In this course, students will learn the basics of videography, as it relates to online and television news production. They will shoot and edit video to create both stand-alone items and video newscasts
Introduction to Health Sciences (IHDC)	PHJ4T	Winter 2012	In this course, students will develop a basic understanding of the health care system and the various professions in the multi-disciplinary health care team.
Exploring Art and Design (AFLC) (Manitoulin Delivery Only)	AEB4T	Winter 2012	In this course, students will develop an overview of art and design career options through a process of portfolio development. Students will discover the various skills required and the various careers available in the art and design professions. The students will work on projects spanning the continuum from traditional arts and crafts to leading edge technical applications using digital media.

Students will discuss the growth and development of the Industry as well as projections into the future of Hospitality Industry.
