## **Decision Making in our Organization**

### **Objective**

This one-day workshop will be for anyone who is looking to improve their decision-making skills in their organizations. It will explore the appropriateness of decision-making styles, examine the consequences of each style, evaluate the consequences of the decision itself, and, from a leadership perspective, itemize the acceptability criteria for decisions made in team environments.

The workshop will apply a decision-making process to various situations. From this we will be able to define the better decisions, analyze the relationship between decisions and choices, select the appropriate decision-making styles, assess acceptability criteria, separate logical and factual decisions from intuitive and emotional decisions, using decision-making tools, and analyze the moral dimensions of decision-making.

### **Process**

Participants will participate in a variety of small-group exercises designed to stimulate discussion of the topics covered and practice techniques for later use in a work environment. They will engage in discussions and role plays to illustrate the content of the course.

### **Participants will be able to:**

- focus decision making around the needed results of a team or work community
- make informed decisions
- consider the logical and emotional aspects of a decision
- apply appropriate tools for decision making
